

COVID-19

To help all feel secure and safe, we ask everyone to follow a few simple guidelines:

Entering and exiting the building (for the purpose of traffic flow):

Enter the building through the door by the circle (back door of the sanctuary; NW side of building, on Red Oak Drive side) or the kitchen door (SE side of building). As much as possible, don't use the brick building, due to possible congestion outside of Redeemed Life Church.

Exit the building through the handicap church doors (in the front of sanctuary, opposite bathrooms).

If you use a cane, please bring and use it.

Seating:

We will spread out the chairs in family/couple groups of 2-4 and use the entire sanctuary for seating.

After the service, chairs will be sanitized as well as doorknobs, light switches, and railings.

Changes during the service:

We will shorten the service to one hour or less. It will consist of worship (2-3 songs) and preaching of the Word.

Tithes and offerings will not take place during the service. We will have baskets at the entrance and exit doors where you can give them.

There will be no bulletins. We will continue to send the "Church Newsletter" (*Life on the Rock*) through email as our Sunday bulletin. If you desire a printed copy to be sent in the mail, please call or email the church office (cboffice79@icloud.com) and provide your name and address.

There will be no beverages or food provided at this time.

We will endeavor (as weather permits) to keep windows open and fans on during the service.

Always try to maintain 6 feet or more spacing between yourself and others.

Wear face covering: When singing, when coming or going and when having conversations.

Prayer: There will be a designated safe place to receive prayer after the service.

Fellowship: Will take place outside (as weather permits), after the service.

Sickness: If you or a family member are sick, please stay home and let us know so that we can pray for you.

Please let Pastor Gordy know:

If a person diagnosed with COVID-19 has been in our facilities, we must and will notify local health officials. Confidentiality will be kept as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

If you have been exposed to a person diagnosed with COVID-19, you are to stay at home and self-monitor for symptoms and follow CDC guidance if symptoms develop.
