

Fullness of Redemption

Redemption declares God's love for the world.

Jn 3:16-17 "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life. 17 "For God did not send the Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world might be saved through Him. (Eph 5:2, 25; Gal 2:20)

Redemption demonstrate God's love for the world.

Rom 5:6-10 For while we were still helpless, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. 7 For one will hardly die for a righteous man; though perhaps for the good man someone would dare even to die. 8 But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. 9 Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from the wrath of God through Him. 10 For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life. (Jn 15:13; 1Tim 1:16)

Redemption gives eternal life to all who believe in Him.

Rom 6:23 For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus (Jn 3:16-17, 36; 1Jn 2:25; Rom 5:21)

Redemption gives us the gift of faith to respond to God.

Eph 2:8 For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; 9 not as a result of works, so that no one may boast.

Gal 3:23 But before faith came, we were kept in custody under the law, being shut up to the faith which was later to be revealed.

Redemption paid the ransom price for our sin.

Mt 20:28 just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many." (Mk 10:45; Ps 49:7-8)

1Tim 2:6 who gave Himself as a ransom for all, the testimony given at the proper time.

Redemption reconciles us to God.

Rom 5:10 For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life. (2Cor 5:18-21)

Redemption forgives our sins.

Eph 1:7 In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace (Col 2:13; Rom 4:6-8; Ps 32:1-2)

1Jn 2:12 I am writing to you, little children, because your sins have been forgiven you for His name's sake. (Ac 2:38)

Redemption saves us from the wrath of God.

Rom 5:9 Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from the wrath of God through Him. (Jn 5:24; Eph 2:3)

1Thes 5:9 For God has not destined us for wrath, but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, (1Thes 1:10)

Redemption cancels the legal demands of the Law against us.

Col 2:13 when you were dead in your transgressions and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He made you alive together with Him, having forgiven us all our transgressions, 14 having canceled out the certificate of debt consisting of decrees against us, which was hostile to us; and He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross. (Mt 18:21-35)

Redemption gives us peace.

Rom 5:1 Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, (Isa 57:19; Jn 16:33)

Redemption declares that we are righteous.

2 Cor 5:21 He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him. (Rom 3:21-26; 5:17-19)

Redemption declares us justified in God's sight.

Rom 5:9 Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from the wrath of God through Him. (Rom 3:28; Titus 3:7)

Gal 2:16 nevertheless knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the Law but through faith in Christ Jesus, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, so that we may be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the Law; since by the works of the Law no flesh will be justified.

Redemption frees us from condemnation.

Rom 8:1 Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. 2 For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. (Rom 8:34)

Redemption cleanses your conscience.

Heb 9:14 how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without blemish to God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God? (1Pt 3:21)

Redemption frees us from the bondage to the fear of death.

Heb 2:14-15 Therefore, since the children share in flesh and blood, He Himself likewise also partook of the same, that through death He might render powerless him who had the power of death, that is, the devil, 15 and might free those who through fear of death were subject to slavery all their lives.

Redemption frees us from the slavery of sin.

Rev 1:5 from Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth. To Him who loves us and released us from our sins by His blood (Jn 8:31-32,36)

Redemption brings us into a relationship with God.

1Pt 3:18 For Christ also died for sins once for all, the just for the unjust, so that He might bring us to God, having been put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit; (Eph 2:13; Jn 17:3)

Redemption gives us confidence to enter into relationship with Him

Heb 10:19-20 Therefore, brethren, since we have confidence to enter the holy place by the blood of Jesus, 20 by a new and living way which He inaugurated for us through the veil, that is, His flesh, (Eph 2:18; Jn 14:6)

Redemption is the path to holiness.

Col 1:22 yet He has now reconciled you in His fleshly body through death, in order to present you before Him holy and blameless and beyond reproach (Heb 10:14)

Redemption defeats the power of the devil.

Col 2:14 having canceled out the certificate of debt consisting of decrees against us, which was hostile to us; and He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross. 15 When He had disarmed the rulers and authorities, He made a public display of them, having triumphed over them through Him. (1Jn 3:8; Heb 2:14-15)

Redemption enables us to walk in the power of God.

Rom 1:16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. (1Cor 1:18, 24)

Redemption heals our physical bodies.

1Pt 2:24 and He Himself bore our sins in His body on the cross, so that we might die to sin and live to righteousness; for by His wounds you were healed. (Isa 53:5; Mt 8:16-17)

Redemption blesses us in every area of life.

Rom 8:32 He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him over for us all, how will He not also with Him freely give us all things?

1Cor 2:12 Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may know the things freely given to us by God,

2Pt 1:2-3 Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord; 3 seeing that His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the true knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence.

Redemption destroys hostility between races.

Eph 2:14-19 For He Himself is our peace, who made both groups into one and broke down the barrier of the dividing wall, 15 by abolishing in His flesh the enmity, which is the Law of commandments contained in ordinances, so that in Himself He might make the two into one new man, thus establishing peace, 16 and might reconcile them both in one body to God through the cross, by it having put to death the enmity. 17 AND HE CAME AND PREACHED PEACE TO YOU WHO WERE FAR AWAY, AND PEACE TO THOSE WHO WERE NEAR; 18 for through Him we both have our access in one Spirit to the Father. 19 So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints, and are of God's household,
